

PROBABLE CAUSE STATEMENT

I, Detective Euton 321 with St. Charles County Drug Task Force a law enforcement agency, state that the facts contained herein are true to my best knowledge and belief and that any false statements made are punishable by law.

1. On 06/15/2016, at 3 [redacted] Southwick Drive, St. Charles, MO 63301, in St. Charles County, MO, Kenneth Dale Sims II (suspects) did:

commit the offense of possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute.

On 06/15/2016 Officers from the St. Charles County Swat Team and St Charles County Drug Task Force executed a search warrant at 3 [redacted] Southwick Drive, St. Charles, Missouri 63301. Sims was located inside the residence by members of the SWAT Team. Sims confirmed his vehicle was parked in the driveway of the residence. During a post Miranda interview, inside the residence, with Sims he admitted he was possessing a "small amount" of marijuana in his vehicle. A search of Sim's vehicle revealed the following:

- Black "Lindenwood" cloth bag containing:
 - 4 plastic baggies containing marijuana
 - 2 glass jars containing marijuana
 - 1 digital scale
 - 1 box of sandwich baggies
- Missouri I.D. issued to Kenneth D. Sims II and a Lindenwood University Assistant Football Coach Business Card bearing the name Kenneth D. Sims II.

The preliminary weight of the marijuana seized from Sims vehicle is 108 grams.

The homeowner of 3 [redacted] Southwick Drive, Benjamin Wilson, was arrested during the search warrant (currently being held at SCCDOC on charges stemming from the search warrant). During a post Miranda interview with Benjamin Wilson he admitted that Sims is a football coach at Lindenwood University. Wilson also admitted that he (Wilson) has been purchasing quantities of marijuana from Sims for the past year.

Sims provided written consent to search his residence (located in Florissant, Missouri). During a search of the residence 2 large mason jars containing marijuana were located (warrant application to be submitted to the St. Louis County Prosecuting Attorney's Office at a later date).
